

BABA SAHEB AMBEDKAR

Key Contributions

Russo-Ukrainian War

Roots of the war begin from 1991. Soviet Union was dissolved, and modern-day Russia was formed. Russian democracy is symbolic in nature. It masks their dream of their Communist utopia. Russia had its puppet state in Ukraine till 2014. As we know that Russia supplies 30% of Europe's natural gas, all Russia's neighbours are dependent on it for natural gas. That's why no one dares to criticise Russia. NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organisation) believed that this was destroying their dream of an anti-Russian Europe. They made Estonia. Latvia and Lithuania their allies and supplied them weapons and missiles for their security but, it was for preparing them against Russia. They told Ukraine to join NATO because then they will be self-dependent and have security against enemies. The real reason was they wanted to deploy their army in Ukraine against Russia because Ukraine had its longest boundary with Russia. Ukrainian government refused because it was a puppet state of Russia, and its duty was to protect the interest of Russia in Ukraine. The nationalists in Ukraine were infuriated and they started a nationalist movement in Ukraine (2014). The government was overthrown. Russia was infuriated and started to invade Crimea (in southern Ukraine). Russia defended its act by saying that they were sending "peacekeeping troops" to defend the old government. USA said that if they attack Ukraine in the future again, it will be full-blown war. Ukraine's newly formed government found itself trapped in ego-war between Russia and USA. If we dive into history, we can see numerous wars happened because of these nations and only small and weak nations get trapped. If USA really cared about these small nations, they wouldn't have left Afghanistan overnight. If we see the bilingual map of Ukraine, we see that most of the land in the west of river Dnieper (which goes through middle of Ukraine) speaks Russian and nationality of more than 75% people is Russian. So they supported Russia's act in Crimea and they will support Russia in the upcoming war. Russia declared war on Ukraine in 2021. EU (European Union) and NATO declared war on Russia. India remained neutral . PM Modi said that "it is not the time of war". Russia allied with Belarus in late 2021. Millions of people have died and are dying in this devastating war. Ukraine has annexed Kiev, Lutsk, Zhytomyr back in its nation after Russia. conquered it . bombings on schools, hospitals and other public places left a great impact on human values. Donald trump had withdrawn his support and aid from Ukraine saying that Zelenskyy was wasting both resources and time of both the countries. Germany and other EU members consoled Zelenskyy by saying that EU is with Ukraine until end of the war. On the funeral of Pope Francis, Zelenskyy and Trump held a personal meeting on the sideline of the funeral. After the discussions, President Trump doubted Putin's intent to end the war and hinted at further sanctions against Russia



But they forget that war is marked by widespread violence, destruction of property, and significant loss of life.

Acts of war challenge the human rights framework almost to the point where it seems to collapse. It is hard to see any place for human rights when human life is deliberately targeted, or where it is seen as "collateral damage" in the course of mass bombing campaigns, which either directly or indirectly lead to sickness, disease, suffering, destruction of homes, and death. In times of war, particularly wars which last for years on end, every human right appears to be affected adversely.

The recently ended Israel and Gaza war is one of the perfect examples of human suffering and destruction.

Gaza war has been fought between Israel and Palestinian militant groups in the Gaza Strip. It started on 7 October 2023 and ended on 19 January 2025. It is the 15th war of the Israel Gaza conflict.

The main reason of the Israel Gaza war was persecution, political instability and economic hardships of the Jewish people. Additionally, factors like the Jewish-Roman Wars, Roman rule, and later, the rise of Christianity, led to restrictions and forced expulsions of Jewish communities, contributing to the Diaspora. In the modern era, political tensions, economic challenges, and security concerns have also prompted Jewish emigration from Israel, with some individuals seeking new lives in Europe or other parts of the world.

1. Persecution:

The rise of Nazi Germany led the systematic persecution and murder of millions of Jewish people in Europe. This led to the massive migration of the Jewish people to Palestine. The Jewish-Roman Wars and subsequent Roman rule resulted in the forced exile of many Jews from Judea, contributing to the spread of Jewish communities across the Roman Empire and beyond.

2. Political Conflict:

The Great Revolt in the 1st and 2nd centuries CE led to the destruction of Judea and the scattering of Jews across the Roman world. The establishment of the State of Israel and the subsequent 1948 Arab-Israeli War led to the displacement and emigration of many Palestinians, as well as the influx of Jewish refugees into Israel.

3. Economic and Social Factors:

Throughout history, economic opportunities in other countries have attracted Jewish communities, leading them to leave their homes. Many factors like the high cost of living and economic challenges in Israel have also contributed to migration.

4. New beginning of the Jews:

While some Jews left Israel, others have immigrated to Israel from various parts of the world, driven by a desire to reach their homeland. Many Jews, regardless of their religious background, find new opportunities and a better quality of life in other countries.

It is just one example for reference there are many countries that always have the clouds of war hovering over them. If people will not mend their ways then the doomed day is not far.
